	ethnic territory of the Kazakh people
Relevance	Relevance of the work is determined by comparative consideration of historical written data and oral data on an interdisciplinary basis, analysis of stable worldview categories, which are one of the important characteristics of national cultural images, consideration of the concept of Homeland in the concept of nomads in close connection with the concept of cultural landscape. In the course of the research, the problems of ethnic history of the Kazakh people are
	studied by analysing the history of permanent migration paths and routes as sacred loci, their marking, sacred geography, and the history of the formation of ethnotoponyms. Thus, it is determined that the new project will conduct a comprehensive study of the ethnic territory and socio-cultural space of nomads, in close connection with the worldview values of the Kazakh people.
Goal	Studying the problems of the formation of the ethnic territory of the
	Kazakh people on the basis of determining the formation and semantics of medieval toponymy through written data and oral data, including the manifestations of knowledge preserved and transmitted in oral literature samples.
Tasks	 study of theoretical and methodological aspects of the formation and location of Turkic tribes based on toponymic research; determine migration movements and ethno-historical connections of Turkic tribes on the basis of "migration of toponyms" according to oral literature and written data; analysis the ethnogenetic relations of the Turkic peoples by analyzing the toponyms formed on the basis of the ethnonyms of the medieval Eastern Dasht-i Kypchak tribes ("92 Uzbek tribes") in the territory of Central Asia; description of the ethno-historical situation in the Early Turkic and Late Middle Ages by studying medieval ethnonyms and anthroponyms in the chronicles of nomadic Turko-Mongol peoples making a historical-philosophical analysis of the sacred topography of Kazakhstan by analyzing the cultural-semiotic meaning of the concept of sacred space or homeland in the concept of nomads;
	 to determine the existing stations, place and water names connecting along historical roads, to make a historical and toponymic reconstruction on the basis of oral, written and cartographic data related to medieval hiking routes, communication routes (Abylay road, Khan road, Abylai's black road, yellow pass that Abylai Khan did not cross, Satbai road, Saryesik Atyrau road, Zhetikonur road, etc.); historical and ethnographic analysis of historical and toponymic legends associated with ancient agricultural fields, temporary livestock settlements, traces of development of temporary settlements, roads between indigenous Kazakh villages, rocky mountain passes, desert and sandy passes; examining the continuity of the historical and spiritual bases of the formation of the worldview and ethnic consciousness and feelings as actual problems of the ethnogenesis of the Kazakh people.
Expected and Achieved Results	The results of scientific research on the project will be published in 2 (two) articles or reviews in a peer-reviewed scientific publication with a 35 (thirty-five) percentile on the Social Science Citation Index or Arts and Humanities Citation Index of the Web of Science base and (or) CiteScore on the Scopus base. - at the same time, at least 4 (four) articles will be published in a peer-reviewed foreign and (or) domestic publication recommended by the state educational standard. 2) one collective illustrated monograph "Medieval toponyms and the formation of the ethnic territory of the Kazakh people: ethno-ontological analysis" will be published based on scientific results; 3) Based on the results of the project, an author's certificate for a
