THE OVERALL RESULTS OF THE QUESTIONNAIRE «TEACHER THROUGH THE EYES OF STUDENTS- 2022»

Conducting a study

The survey was conducted in the Univer system from March 17 to May 7, 2023. 12,182 respondents took part in the survey – 78.76% (this type of survey covers only students who have theoretical training in this semester).

As part of the survey, a traditional scale from 1 to 5 was used for all questions, where 1 means the lowest level and 5 means the highest.

Rating scale:

5 points quality is ALMOST ALWAYS manifested;

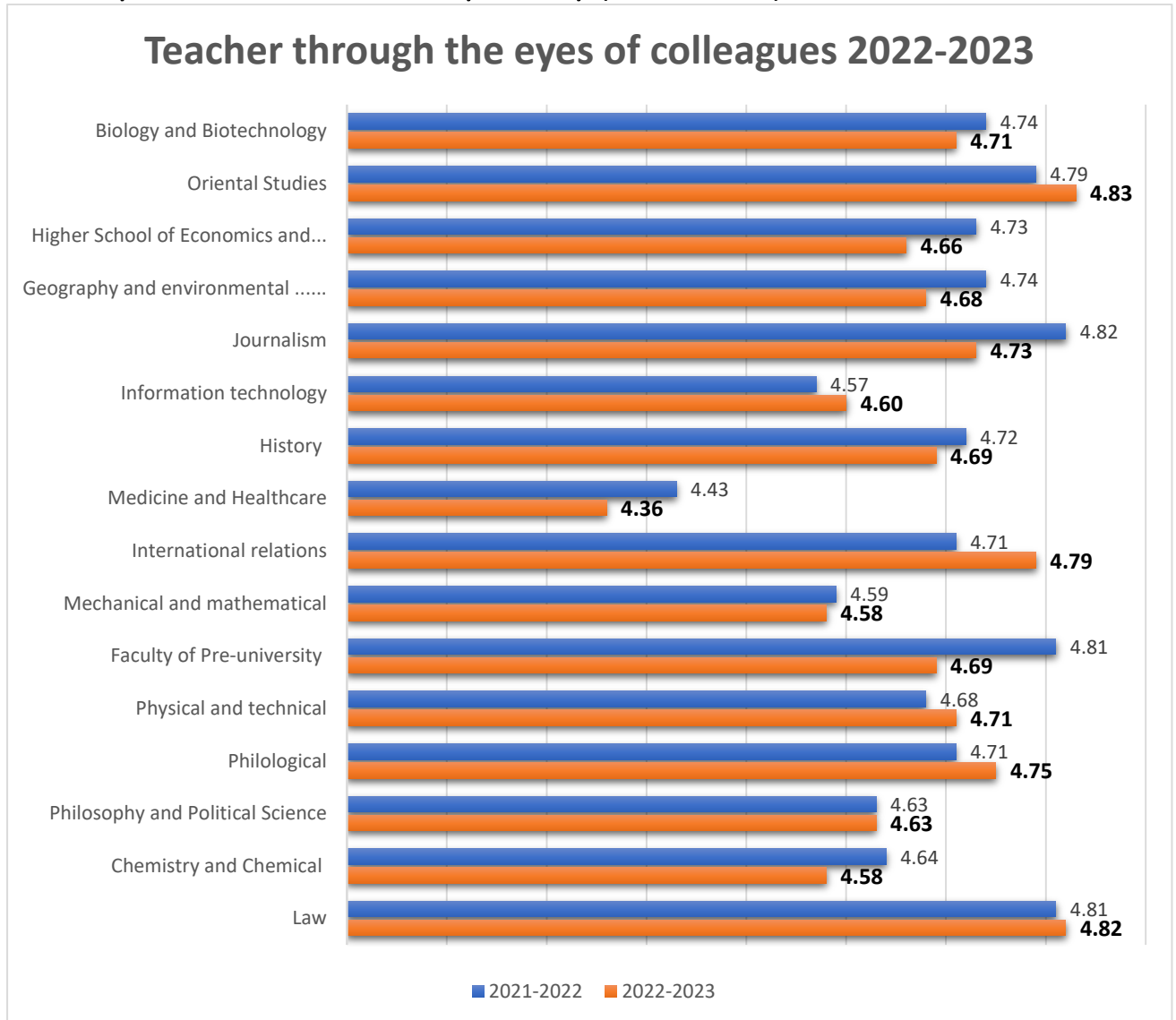
4 points – quality is OFTEN manifested;

3 points – the quality is manifested by 50%

2 points – the quality is RARELY manifested

1 point – the quality is practically non-existent.

2. Dynamics of indicators by faculty (2022-2023)



Brief conclusions and recommendations.

The questionnaire contains 14 questions and provides an opportunity to evaluate courses and the quality of teaching according to various criteria. As part of the survey, scaling is used for all questions on a traditional scale from 1 to 5.0, where 1.0 means the lowest level and 5.0 means the highest.

1) According to the results of the survey of the 2022-2023 academic year, 12182 (78.76%) students evaluated the work of **2427 teachers**.

2) The average score at the university is **4.67**. The average result for the departments ranges from 4.13 (Department of Clinical Specialties) to 4.91 (Department of the Far East).

The work of teachers from only 2 departments out of 69 departments of the university (67 departments, college, specialized school) was evaluated below 4.0 points: the Department of Clinical Disciplines - 3.74, the Department of Fundamental Medicine - **3.81**.

3) Positive dynamics in all indicators. In general, according to the results of the 2022-2023 academic year, 76.63% (1,860 teachers) rated the work quite highly – the interval from 4.99 to 4.0 points. **Score 5.0** – 440 teacher – 18.13%. In comparison with the survey in 2022, the indicator increased by 4.4%, from 2021 – by 18%. **The critical result was recorded** in the work evaluations of 0.16% of teachers (student assessment): 1-2.99 – 4 teachers.

Low scores: 3.00 – 3.49 – 32 the teacher; 3.50-3.99 – 81 the teacher.

The percentage of low grades of teaching staff decreased by 3 times in comparison with the 2022-2023 academic year.

4) Among the assessments of the quality of the organization of the educational process, it is possible to note the following aspects:

- Students note that throughout the training, the teacher demonstrated deep knowledge and fluency in the course – **81.38%**

- The teacher gave a complete picture of the course content – **81.02%**

- The teacher managed to arouse interest in the subject – **80.62%**

- The teacher used active learning strategies and engaged in discussion – **80.93%**

5) **Evaluation of the effectiveness of the courses**. In general, the university received an assessment of 2,475 disciplines in all faculties and specialties. The assessment is formed relative to each course.

Disciplines with assessment:

1.0 – 2.99 points – 0.65% (16 courses)

3.0 – 3.99 points – 3.92% (97 courses)

4.0 – 4.49 points – 9.21% (228 courses)

4.5 – 4.99 points – 48.93% (1211 courses)

5.0 points – 37.29% (923 courses) – an increase of 9.18% compared to 2022.

Students note the high quality and usefulness of the disciplines of various educational programs – **80.07%**

80.3% of the surveyed students confidently recommend the studied courses to other students.

According to the faculties, the highest and lowest result (positive assessment and recommendation for study):

89.47% of students of the Faculty of Law.

53.11% - Faculty of Medicine and Healthcare (increased by 6%).

In general, the effectiveness of the course content was highly appreciated – **79.84%**
