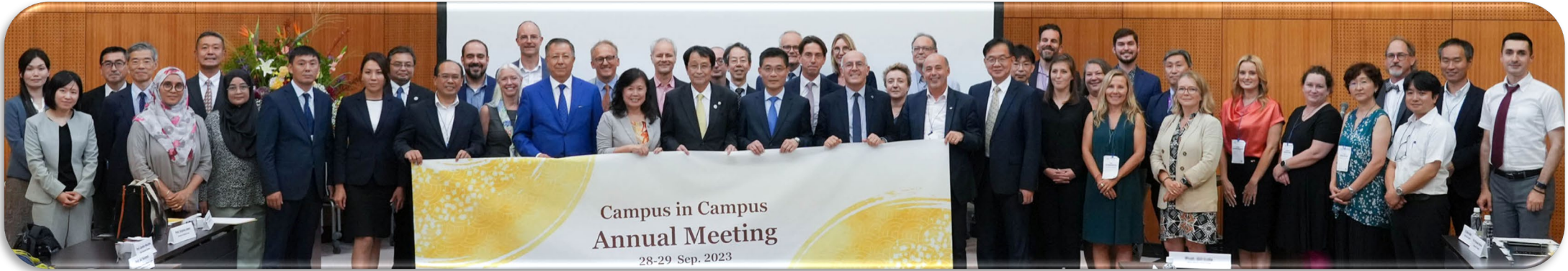
The **Campus-in-Campus (CiC)** initiative enables students and staff to engage in global education and research, overcoming organizational and national barriers.



It is achieved by establishing mini-campuses overseas to foster a transborder environment and sharing educational and research resources among partners.

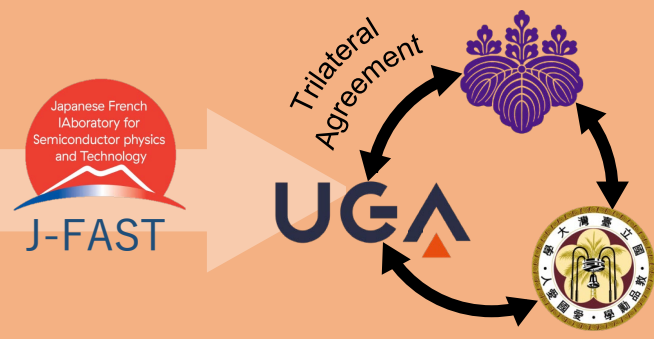

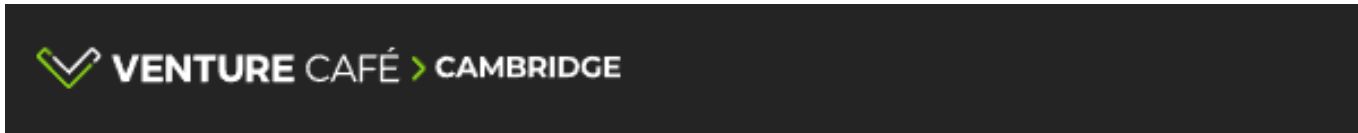
Profile of Exchange Students
