Relevance	By the end of the 20th century, Kazakh language became one of the endangered languages of the world. The demand for learning language was low. Despite the publication of works on the study of the Kazakh language, most of them were based on the works of Soviet times. These works were focused on domestic demand, that is, for the Russian- speaking audience. Many textbooks were written without any competitive spirit. However, over the past 10 years, the situation with the Kazakh language has begun to change for the better. Due to the increase in requests for the study of the Kazakh language, textbooks with better content began to be published. These benefits mainly meet the needs of the domestic market. External needs are not adequately met. Potential visitors decide to study Russian due to the lack of the necessary resources to study the Kazakh language. Lack of necessary resources pushes tourists and other visitors to abandon the Kazakh language. Thus, leaving many cultural, ethnic, and other features of Kazakh culture closed to visitors. This factor not only interferes with the promotion of the Kazakh language and culture, but also negatively affects ethno-tourism and the image of the country. Therefore, the solution to this issue is of strategic importance for the state. One of the main reasons for the lack of resources is the extremely small number of Kazakh language teachers who speak English. Consequently, lack of knowledge of English also leads to the problem of developing materials on Kazakh culture and language for the English-speaking contingent. In this regard, the project team is formed of specialists in Kazakh and English languages and wishes to develop, in cooperation, a textbook and website for English-speaking consumers. As a result of the elaborated materials, the research group will contribute to solving the problem of the lack of educational materials oriented for the English-speaking audience.
