

Brief information about the project

Name of the project	AP09260449 «Production everyday life at defence enterprises in Kazakhstan and Urals-Volga Region of Russia in the years of the Great Patriotic War: a comparative analysis» (0223PK00610)
Relevance	The study of industrial everyday life on the materials of Kazakhstan and the Ural-Volga region of Russia allows us to identify the common and special in the living and working conditions, labour motivation and self-identification of people taking into account the shift of the industrial centre of the USSR to the East. Turning to the experience of production everyday life of workers of defence enterprises allows us to reconstruct the life of the leading social group of Soviet society, which appeared in the previous works under the impersonal names of "industrial cadres" or "labour resources".
Purpose	The aim of the project is a comprehensive comparative analysis of the production everyday life of workers in the defence enterprises of Kazakhstan and the Ural-Volga region of Russia during the Great Patriotic War.
Objectives	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. to characterise the changes in the quantitative and qualitative composition of workers of defence enterprises in the rear regions of the USSR (gender, age, skill level) caused by the war;2. to analyse the impact of evacuation processes on production everyday life;3. to evaluate and compare the ways of mobilisation and movement of labour resources from the Central Asian Military District (SAVO) to the Ural-Volga region of Russia and evacuation of workers of defence enterprises to the East;4. to analyse the living and working conditions of workers from Central Asia and Kazakhstan in the Urals-Volga region of Russia;5. to examine the material and living and sanitary-hygienic conditions of life of the workers of the enterprises;6. to investigate the working conditions, salary level, and supply system of the workers of the enterprises;7. to study the relationships in labour collectives taking into account gender, national and migration factors;8. to examine the manifestations of deviant behaviour among the employees of enterprises;9. to study the factors that influence the behaviour and motivation of all participants of the labour process;10. to analyse the influence of agitation and propaganda means on production indicators;11. to study the attraction and conditions of child labour at defence enterprises;12. to analyse the structural changes in gender occupational segregation caused by wartime;13. to approbate and multiply the obtained research results by presenting reports at Kazakhstani and

	<p>international scientific conferences; publishing articles in peer-reviewed foreign scientific editions indexed by international databases and peer-reviewed foreign and domestic editions with non-zero impact factor (recommended by the Kazakhstan and the Russian Federation's Higher Attestation Commission);</p> <p>14. to integrate the problematics into the educational process by including new topics (modules) in the general courses, topics of diploma theses and master's theses.</p> <p>The main goals and objectives formulated in the work have determined the choice of appropriate conceptual and methodological approaches necessary for their solution. The research objectives of the project will be solved through the introduction and analysis of a new set of historical sources, both extracted from archives and sources of personal origin, which is one of the main prerequisites for achieving the project's goal.</p>
<p>Expected and achieved results</p>	<p>In this project, the main research paradigms are analysed; changes in the quantitative and qualitative composition of workers are investigated; the specifics of the movement of labour resources are presented; the material and living conditions of life and work of workers, the level of wages, the supply system, relations in labour collectives and manifestations of deviant behaviour among workers of enterprises are studied; the factors that influenced the behaviour and motivation of all participants in the labour process are investigated; the involvement of all participants in the labour process is analysed.</p> <p>The main provisions of the project were tested at the conferences of the International Institute of Social History (IISH), the Association for Slavic, East European and Eurasian Studies (ASEEES), the Society for Central Eurasian Studies (CESS), the European Society for Central Asian Studies (ESCAS) and etc. The results of the research were incorporated into the educational process, 10 topics of diploma theses, master's, candidate's (RF) and doctoral (PhD) theses were approved.</p> <p>During the period of the project realization there were published a collective monograph (the author's certificate was received) «Production everyday life at the defense enterprises of Kazakhstan and the Ural-Volga region of Russia in the war years (1941-1945)» Collective monograph / Edited by R.S. Zharkynbaeva, M.N. Potemkina. - Almaty: Kazak University, 2023. - 379 p., 33 articles, including 4 in publications included in the Scopus database (Q2, Q3), 8 - recommended by Committee for control of Education and Science, Higher Attestation Commission of RF; 3 - in peer-reviewed foreign publications, 18 - in Conference Materials.</p> <p>The main provisions and results of the research can be used by:</p>

	<p>- specialists of various scientific directions, in particular, historians, philologists, sociologists, political scientists, anthropologists and specialists of other humanitarian directions;</p> <p>- government agencies and analytical structures in Kazakhstan and Russia dealing with social policy, labour relations, and gender studies;</p> <p>The main results of the project will be disseminated among research and educational institutions of Kazakhstan and Russia, archives of Kazakhstan and Russia, specialised foreign research networks, foreign institutes and universities, with which members of the research group maintain scientific contacts.</p> <p>The realisation of the Project will allow state bodies to:</p> <p>- create political-legal, socio-economic and organisational conditions aimed at improving the system of motivation to work for employees of industrial enterprises;</p> <p>- will contribute to the improvement of the state social policy.</p> <p>The study of industrial everyday life makes it possible to identify the place of man in the process of production of material and intellectual goods, to analyse the motives, organisation and results of his labour activity, mechanisms of interaction in labour collectives, forms of socio-cultural and political-educational work at enterprises and institutions and, on this basis, to determine the nature and direction of transformations in the economy, politics and culture of society.</p>
