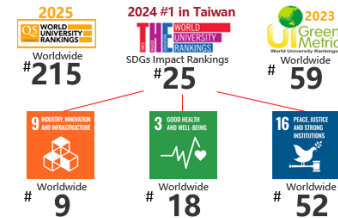

Ladies and gentlemen, Good day! I am Sun-Yuan Hsieh, a Chair Professor and the Vice President for International Affairs of National Cheng Kung University. I will give a very brief introduction to NCKU and our practices to achieve SDGs.

1. (先輕鬆開場，因此故意先講 block 1) NCKU is located in Tainan City, which has just been selected by CNN as one of the 24 best places to visit in the world. It is because the 400-year-old Tainan City is not just culturally rich, but also rich in ecology. For example, during the winter season, the endangered Black-Faced Spoonbill will fly from South Korea to Taiwan to spend their winter at the “曾文 River” of Tainan City. On the other hand, NCKU is ranked #215 in QS ranking, and has high achievement in meeting United Nation’s SDG. Specifically, NCKU is ranked as #1 in Taiwan (and #25 in the world) according to the latest THE SDGs Impact Rankings, and also ranked globally 9th in SDG 9, 18th in SDG 3, and 52nd in SDG 16, along with a notable 59th place in the UI Green Metric global ranking.

2. Currently, we have more than 2 thousands faculty members and more than 22 thousands students, and this scale ranks NCKU as the second largest university in Taiwan. We also run our own NCKU hospital, which not only has the highest surplus among public hospitals in Taiwan, but also enriches our geriatric medicine research power that is also critical for current Japan’s society.

3. Besides 9 traditional colleges, including College of Medicine and College of Engineering, etc., NCKU has two newly launched colleges. One is AISSM, the Academy of Innovative Semiconductor and Sustainable Manufacturing, which is for all kind of semiconductor researches. The other is Miin Wu School of Computing, which is for law-related AI and brain-related AI researches, sponsored by the Macronix Electronics.

4. According to the ESI ranking, we have 16 fields that are ranked within the Top 1%, including those key areas like “Computer Sciences” and “Material Sciences”, etc.

And if we are focused just on the Engineering area, we are proud to claim that NCKU is ranked as #1 in Taiwan. This fact well echoes the historical milestone that

the first college of NCKU is the College of Engineering.

5. Beside 6 featured research centers, which are highly selective by Taiwan’s Ministry of Education, we also have numerous internationally well recognized research fields. Due to time limitation, let me just name two representative examples. For example, in the space exploration area, we are very well cooperated with Kyoto University to jointly develop radar satellite technologies, and closely worked with industry and government to deliver the AMS system, which has been noticed by the Head of the Department of Physics at MIT and NASA’s Director of International Space Station. For another example, our quantum research center, known as QFort, has remarkable research achievements, including one single professor publishing 6 papers on Nature over the past 5 years. The third example, our center for shrimp aquaculture stands as Taiwan’s sole reference laboratory recognized by the World Organization for Animal Health (OIE) for two shrimp diseases: White Spot Disease (WSD) and Acute Hepatopancreatic Necrosis Disease (AHPND).

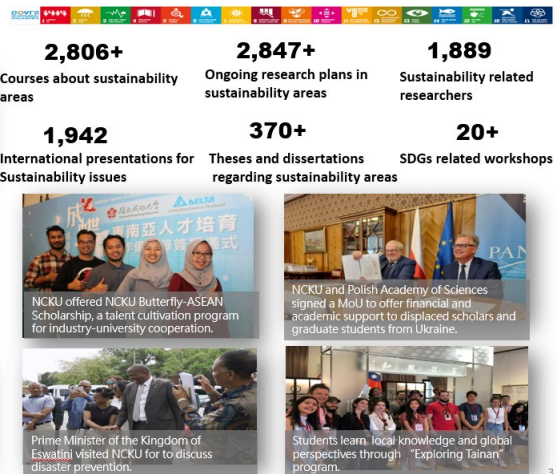
6. Besides Kyoto University mentioned above, we have many partner universities in Japan, such as Tokyo Tech, Tsukuba University, and Kumamoto University.

此外，我們也致力於連結培育在地人才，結合政府資源和 USR 計畫。例如：精進學校午餐、建構一個高齡者與非高齡者之間彼此互動與支持的社會結構、以及協助極限村落發展在地經濟。

Social Responsibilities

To promote cultural implementation, we have established a database for Taiwan Studies and utilized new media such as a YouTube channel, podcasts, as well as new technologies like AR and VR, to bring students to connect deeply with Taiwan's history and its interactions with the world.

We have received top 1 prizes in Taiwan regarding to University Social Responsibility Awards.

Furthermore, we are committed to connect and nurture local talents by integrating government resources and Social Responsibility (USR) projects, such as improving school lunches in rural areas, establishing social supportive systems, and promoting the development of local economies in disadvantaged communities.

透過 NCKU Butterfly 成蝶計畫：促進東南亞人才培育，增進學生與產業接軌的實務技能。

成大與波蘭科學院 Polish Academy of Sciences (PAS) 簽署合作備忘錄，提供資金以協助烏克蘭學者及研究生延續教育研究計畫。

史瓦帝尼王國的總理訪問 NCKU，探討災害預防技術教育，以及政府單位、地方社區和專家團隊之間的災害控制。

透過踏溯台南課程，學生培養本土知識以及全球視野。

Sustainable Education

In response to the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), as of 2023, we have offered over 2,800 courses in sustainability-related fields and ongoing research projects. We also have 1,889 researchers engaged in sustainability-related studies, along with numerous international papers and workshops focused on sustainability.

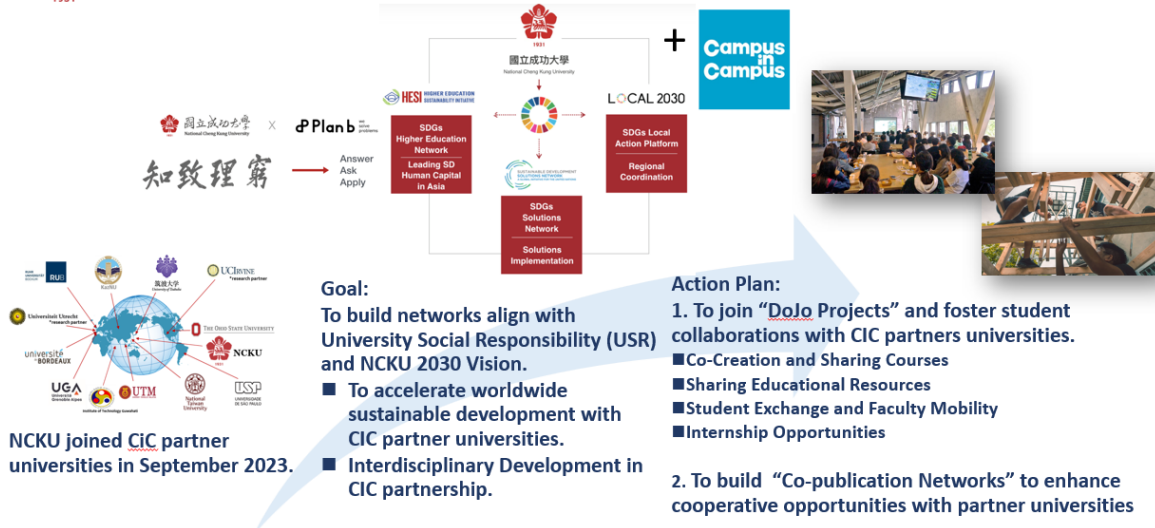
Moreover, we are committed to forging inclusive and sustainable communities through global and local partnerships.

For example:

We developed talent cultivation program (成蝶人才培育計畫)with overseas industrial internship;

Offered support to displaced scholars and graduate students from Ukraine through the collaboration with Polish Academy of Sciences (PAS);

Looked into disaster prevention and management mechanism with governmental leaders such as the Prime Minister of the Kingdom of Eswatini (史瓦帝尼王國); Connected international students with local culture and history via Exploring Tainan program.

Action Plan:

To Join “DOJO Projects” and foster student collaborations with CIC partners universities.

To build “Co-publication Networks” to enhance cooperative opportunities with partner universities (for example, selecting a theme each year for partner universities to share their collaborative efforts).



DOJO Projects Tentative Proposal:

- UT students will collaborate with NCKU students at NCKU, serving as a "dojo," where they will identify challenges and propose solutions together.
- With 1-4 weeks short term program in semester breaks.
- 20-30 UT students/round x 2~3 round a year.

Goal:

- From a student-centered project to a gradually increasing collaboration with local businesses.
- From a subject to a DOJO platform.



Example: NCKU's "Exploring Tainan Program"

- A required program for university freshman.
- Elective program for upperclassmen and international students.
- Social practices + Local cultural knowledge + Hands-on activities.
- Enhance sense of local responsibility and global perspective.

20-30 UT students/round x 2~3 round a year. With 1-4 weeks short term program in semester breaks.

This will evolve from a single subject to establishing a cross-disciplinary "dojo platform.

(For example, the Urban Planning Department at National Cheng Kung University is currently planning an exchange with the Art Department at Tsukuba University, focusing on the theme of urban planning.)

Take NCKU "Exploring Tainan Program"(踏溯台南) as an example, this is a required class for first-year students, also open for elective enrollment to upperclassmen and international students. Through practical coursework, it fosters a deep connection with local culture and traditional heritage.

By engaging in hands-on exploration, students internalize local knowledge and social humanities literacy, enhance their sense of local responsibility and global perspective.
