In the past years, my diplomatic service has involved organizing and documenting various state and international events. It was even more rewarding and significant to oversee the PhD dissertation work of Zh. Abdiman, which focused on analyzing the inaugural speeches of the newly elected presidents of the United States and the Republic of Kazakhstan.

Inaugural addresses are especially intriguing to linguists due to their classification as a distinct form of political discourse.

Inaugural speeches take on a solemn ritualistic form, the observance of which necessitates strict regulation by presidents.

Zh. Abdiman successfully understood and presented her doctoral dissertation on the inauguration ceremony, alongside a thorough analysis of the linguistic strategies used in political discourse within the genre of Inaugural Addresses. These addresses were delivered by U.S. Presidents B. Clinton, G. Bush, B. Obama, D. Trump, and J. Biden, as well as the Presidents of the Republic of Kazakhstan, N. A. Nazarbayev and K.-Zh. K. Tokayev, covering the period from 1991 to 2025.

The dissertation topic is highly relevant. The analysis conducted with the chosen representative methodology is competent and qualified. The results obtained align well with the goals and objectives of the study.

They interest the broader scientific community, including linguists, speechwriters, politicians, international relations specialists, journalists, and others.

I would particularly like to emphasize the novelty of the research topic and object for Kazakhstan linguistics.

Sufficient novelty, the relevance of the obtained valid results, the formulated scientific provisions, and the practical value of the work all lead to the conclusion that the doctoral research of Zh. Abdiman is a thorough qualifying study of a current problem. It demonstrates the necessary level of competence in the field of political linguistics and meets the requirements for a PhD dissertation. I recommend that Zh. Abdiman's dissertation work be accepted for defense.

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
