Title	AP23490680 'Labour Mobilization of Population of the Kazakh SSR in 1941-1945: State Policy and Adaptation Practices'
Relevance	The relevance and novelty of this research lie in its exploration of the Soviet state's mobilisation policy during 1941-1945 and its impact on the often dramatic adaptation experiences of the thousands of citizens of the republic who were mobilised for work in industry and construction—hereafter referred to as labour mobilised—both within the republic and beyond its borders. Research into this mobilisation policy will help to determine the role and significance of the individual within the mobilisation economy, as well as analyse their practices of adaptation to the extraordinary conditions of wartime.
Goal	Analysis of the peculiarities of the mobilisation policy of the Soviet state during the war years (1941-1945) and its impact on individual and collective adaptation practices of the population of the KazSSR.
Tasks	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - research of the approaches to the study of the problems of mobilisation economy and social adaptation; - analysis of the mobilisation capabilities of the republic and the effectiveness of the state's mobilisation efforts; - study of the sources of labour resources formation; - research into labour behaviour (strike forms of labour) and the factors influencing the behaviour and motivation of mobilised workers; - analysis of the influence of propaganda and leisure activities on the mood of workers and on relations in labour collectives; - identification of facts of protest behaviour among the mobilised population; - analysis of the impact of living and working conditions of mobilised workers on everyday adaptation practices; - approbation and multiplication of the obtained research results through presentation of reports at Kazakhstani and international scientific conferences; publication of articles in peer-reviewed foreign scientific publications indexed by international databases and peer-reviewed foreign and domestic publications; - integration of the project issues into the educational process.
